Jesus shifts His discussion to Jewish cities, making inflammatory statements about them in comparison to Gentile cities.

Jesus' call to repentance doesn't come without the Gospel. Here He offers a "light burden" to any that would come to Him.

The Sabbath becomes the example of the way that the Jewish religious are following the Law without actual regard to God or man.

 How does "I desire mercy and not sacrifice" fit this situation?

## Matthew 12:8-21 Sabbath Day Test Case

Not only does Jesus heal a man here on the Sabbath, but He actually seems to take people out of the Synagogue to follow Him.

# Matthew 12:22-37 Blasphemy, the Fruit of the Pharisees

Jesus gives a very stern warning to the Pharisees and other religious of Judea, warning them against blaspheming the Holy Spirit and turning their hearts from God.

# Matthew 12:38-45 Demand for Signs

Jesus is asked for signs to legitimate His claims, but responds with more inflammatory comments about the Gentiles taking priority in the kingdom.

 What kind of signs do you think the scribes and Pharisees would have accepted?

# Matthew 12:46-50 Jesus' True Family

Jesus uses a visit from His family to make a point about what really makes people a part of His family.
