


Matthew 15:1-20

Truly Unclean

The Pharisees and scribes seek
Jesus out, even in the Gentile
land. Clearly a fact finding
delegation, they ask Jesus about
the "tradition of the elders" and
how Jesus is training His disciples.
After rebuffing them, Jesus uses
this as an opportunity to teach
about what defiles a person.

Question: What do you think Jesus was doing in ignoring/denying the woman?

Matthew 15:21-28


The Syro-Phoenician Woman

Jesus goes even deeper into Gentile territory, entering even the hostile cities of Tyre and Sidon. Even there someone is seeking Him out so that He might heal her. What follows is a famous exchange between Him and the woman.

Matthew 15:29-39

Jesus Heals and Feeds Gentiles

From Tyre and Sidon, Jesus heals many Gentiles and then engages in a copy-cat miracle. Matthew captures the feeding of the 4,000 showing that it is meant to mimic the feeding of the 5,000 but with a Gentile focus.



Question: What do you suppose the disciples are thinking in this seeming second act of a miracle?



Question: What do you imagine the disciples are thinking about in the boat? How do they get Jesus wrong?

Matthew 16:1-12

The Pharisees and their Leaven

The Pharisees approach Jesus again, this time with their rivals the Sadducees. After a short interaction, Jesus returns to His home base in Capernaum. On the way He has a frustrating conversation with His disciples who seem to get Jesus wrong.


Matthew 16:13-20

Peter Confesses the Christ

Matthew records an important event in the life of the disciples as Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah (the Christ). Jesus then promises to build a new kind of community (church) on this confession.



Question: Who do people think Jesus is? (both then and today)



Question: Why do you think Jesus tells the disciples about His impending death at this time?

Matthew 16:21-23

First Passion Prediction

After Peter confesses that Jesus is the Christ, Jesus gives the disciples the first clear prediction that He is going to die. Peter then tries to rebuke Jesus for this idea.

Matthew 16:24-28

Taking Up the Cross

Jesus then continues to speak to all of the disciples about what they need to be ready for as they continue to follow Him.



Question: What does "take up your cross" mean to the disciples? To us today?
