Week 9 - Matthew 21 and 22 - Into Jerusalem

Matthew 21:1-11	 Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem Jesus enters into Jerusalem with fanfare that makes sure He is noticed, fulfilling messianic prophecies about Himself. Why do you suppose the people do what they do with the fanfare? Instinct? A statement?
Matthew 21:12-17	 Cleansing the Temple In His only recorded truly violent act, Jesus clears the temple of those who are making trade in it. Why do you suppose Jesus cares so much about a Temple that He is replacing with Himself?
Matthew 21:18-27	 Cursing the Fig Tree Jesus reenters Jerusalem after spending the night in Bethany. On the trip back, He foreshadows His visit to Jerusalem by cursing the fig tree and answering a challenge presented to Him. How do you suppose the fig tree is a symbol of Jerusalem?
Matthew 21:28- 22:14	 Three Parables about Jerusalem Matthew records three parables in a row from Jesus, each differing slightly, but speaking directly to the issue of the religious hierarchy in Jerusalem. How do each of these parables differ in their message? How are they similar?
Matthew 22:15-33	 Testing Jesus Two rival groups arrive to test Jesus in succession. Jesus turns each group back having mystified them instead of it going the other way around. What do you suppose the Pharisees or Sadducees had planned for Jesus if they stumped Him? Next page

Matthew 22:34-46Final RebuttalsThe Pharisees rebound after the failure of the

The Phansees rebound after the failure of the Sadducees, but Jesus shuts them down, asking a question of His own that stops the questioning.
