Mark - Week Three - Chapters 5 and 6 - Miracles

Mark 5:1-20	 The Gerasene Demoniac After stilling the sea, Jesus and His disciples land in Gentile territory and are "greeted" by a frightening man who Jesus casts a demon from. This causes the towns people to fear and ask Him to leave. What do you suppose the townspeople are afraid of?
Mark 5:21-43	 Two Miraculous Healings Mark creates an artistic "sandwich" of healings, showing us that there is a connection between these two healings that Jesus does. What is the overall idea that you suppose Mark is pointing to here?
Mark 6:1-6	 Jesus in Nazareth Jesus comes back to His hometown and stays a few days before the Sabbath. Despite His presence even before the Sabbath, His miracles are almost non-existent. On the Sabbath, people take offense. What do you suppose is offensive to the people about Jesus?
Mark 6:7-13	 Twelve Sent Out Jesus sends out His twelve representatives into the surrounding area. Mark's brevity makes us focus on the sparseness of equipment and message of repentance they are preaching. If you were being sent on such a journey, what would you think of packing?
Mark 6:14-32	 Death of John the Baptist Artistically taking our view away from the disciples while they work out their mission, Mark gives us the story of John and Herod. This may be foreshadowing to Jesus' death. How is this similar to Jesus' death? Next page

Mark 6:33-44	 Feeding the 5000 Instead of getting some time away after their mission, the disciples and Jesus are followed into their desolate place by the crowds who need to be fed. Mark is slowing here and giving us
	some details. What details do you notice?
Mark 6:45-52	 Walking on Water Mark shows us that the disciples still don't understand Jesus fully, but are amazed at Him walking on the water. Why do you suppose the disciples'
	"hearts were hardened"?
Mark 6:53-56	 Healing at Gennesaret We find ourselves in (approximately) the same place that we started in chapter 5. Mark speeds up, giving us a quick summary statement of all of the miracles that Jesus is performing during this time. Mark is attempting to show us the reactions of people. What do you suppose these reactions are meant to show us?

Red Letter Challenge this week - Love Your Neighbor

This week, take Jesus' words from Matthew 22:39, <u>"Love your neighbor as yourself</u>" to heart. Technically *everyone* is your neighbor, but this week especially seek out ways to love the people that physically live near you.
